THE WHITE HOUSE



Tour Description: A self-guided tour through the Presidential Residence.

Address: 1600 Pennsylvania Ave, NW

Closest Metro Stops: Federal Triangle (Blue and Orange Lines), Metro Center (Blue, Orange, and Red Lines), and McPherson Square (Blue and Orange Lines)

Availability: Self-guided tours are available from 7:30 am to 11:30 am Tuesday through Thursday, 7:30 am to 1:30 pm Fridays and Saturdays (excluding federal holidays or unless otherwise noted). Tours are scheduled on a first come, first served basis.

Requests can be submitted up to three (3) months in advance. You are encouraged to submit your request as early as possible as a limited number of spaces are available.

THE UNITED STATES CAPITOL



Tour Description: Guided tours of the historic Capitol begin at one of the Capitol Visitor Center's orientation theaters with a 13-minute film, "Out of Many, One," which will take you on a journey through our country's struggle to establish the world's first truly representative democracy and introduce you to the magnificent building that houses our Congress. Once inside the historic Capitol, visitors will see the Crypt, the Rotunda, and National Statuary Hall. All tours begin and end at the Capitol Visitor Center.

Address: East Capitol St NE & First St SE, Washington, DC 20004

Closest Metro Stops: There are three subway stops found within walking distance of the Capitol:

1. Union Station- Located at First Street, NW, and Massachusetts Avenue.
2. Capitol South – Located at First Street between C and D Streets, SE.
3. Federal Center, SW – Located at the southwest corner of Third and D Streets, SW.

Availability: To ensure your ability to participate in a guided tour, advance reservations are strongly recommended. Tour schedules can fill up quickly, so please make your reservation well in advance of your visit. For those that do not have advance reservations, same-day tour passes may be available at the information Desk located on the lower level of the Visitor Center. Tour hours are 8:30am to 4:00 pm Monday through Saturday

THE SUPREME COURT



Tour Description: Although the Supreme Court does not offer guided walking tours, visitors are encouraged to tour the building on their own and take advantage of a variety of educational programs including Courtroom Lectures, a visitors' film, and court-related exhibitions. The Courtroom is located on the First Floor. Court sessions are open to the public on a first-come, first-served basis. In addition to the Courtroom, portions of the First and Ground Floors are open to the public. Highlights include the John Marshall Statue, portraits and busts of Justices, and two self-supporting marble spiral staircases.

Closest Metro Stops: Union Station (Red Line) and Capitol South (Orange, Blue and Silver Lines)

Availability: The building is open Monday-Friday 9am to 4:30pm. Closed on Saturday and Sunday. During the months of March – June, visitors should anticipate longer wait times to enter the building due to larger crowds visiting the Nation's Capital.

THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS



Tour Description: The Library of Congress offers many exciting activities on site. Entrance to the Thomas Jefferson Building is free and open to the public. You may participate in a guided tour or a gallery talk, or take a self-guided tour of the building and the exhibitions.

Closest Metro Stop: Capitol South Metro (Blue and Orange Lines). Alternative stop- Union Station (Red Line)

Availability: Public Tours are available Monday – Friday at 10:30 AM, 11:30 AM, 12:30PM, 1:30 PM, 2:30 PM, 3:30 PM and Saturday 10:30 AM, 11:30 AM, 1:30 PM, 2:30PM. Closed Holidays and Sundays. On Federal Holidays tours begin at 9:30am.

How to request a tour: Public tours are offered to small groups with no more than 10 members without prior reservations. You can call the visitor's center at (202) 707-8000 or email grouptours@loc.gov to schedule a group tour with more than 10 members.

THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES



Tour Description: The National Archives Museum is home of the original Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and Bill of Rights which are housed in the Rotunda for the Charters of Freedom; the Public Vaults permanent exhibit gallery; the David M. Rubenstein Gallery, the Lawrence F. O'Brien temporary exhibit gallery; the Boeing Learning Center; and the William G. McGowan Theater.

Address: The general public entrance is located at the corner of Constitution Avenue and 9th Street.

Closest Metro Stop: Archives-Navy Memorial (Green and Yellow Lines)

Availability: The Museum is Open daily from 10 AM - 5:30 PM (closed Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day).

How to request a tour: Reservations are not required for individuals or groups wishing to enter through the public entrance, however reservations are recommended to avoid excessive lines during the height of the tourist season (March-Labor Day). Reservations can also be made for either guided tours or Timed Visit Entry. There is a \$1.50 convenience fee for online reservations which can be made here

ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY



Tour Description: Visitors are encouraged to discover Arlington's rich history, witness the time-honored ceremonies, take in the scenic landscapes and grounds, wander through the headstones and monuments, reflect on the names, and ponder the stories each person could tell. Highlights include the Memorial Amphitheater, John F. Kennedy Gravesite, The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, The Changing of the Guard Tradition and the Memorial Arboretum

Address: Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, VA 22211

Closest Metro Stop: Arlington Cemetery (Blue Line)

Availability: Open 365 days a year, 8am-7pm (April-September) and 8am-5pm (October-March). Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier occurs each hour on the hour (between Oct. 1 – March 31) and every half hour in the summer months (April 1 – Sep.30).

Costs: Free, but narrated bus tours start from the visitors' center for a cost of: Adults \$13.50,

Children (4-12) \$6.75, Seniors \$10.00. The cost of parking is \$2.00/hour.

Costs: Admission is free for all memorials. There is a small charge for a reserved ticket tour of the Washington Monument.

WASHINGTON MONUMENT



CLOSED UNTIL SPRING 2019

Tour Description: A park ranger will help you board the elevator and provide commentary on the express ascent to the top floor 500 feet above the ground. The ride lasts approximately 70 seconds. Visitors may tour the 500' level observation deck at their leisure. Visitors then proceed down the steps to the 490' level museum. The 490' level contains exhibits and is where visitors enter the queue to re-board the elevator for the descent. Rangers will help you board the elevator and provide commentary on the approximately 2-minute descent. The elevator slows in preprogrammed areas of the monument to provide passengers with views of select areas of the monument's interior. Upon reaching the ground floor, passengers exit

the elevator and the monument.

Closest Metro Stop: Smithsonian (Blue and Orange Lines), Federal Triangle station also provides access to the Washington Monument

Availability: The monument is open daily except for July 4 and December 25 from 9 AM –5 PM, with the last available tour at 4 pm. You can get free Washington Monument tickets at the Washington Monument Lodge on 15th Street adjacent to the Washington Monument starting at 8:30 am. Tickets are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Supplies are limited and tickets often sell out for the entire day. For this reason it is recommended you reserve a ticket in advance. Reservation and mailing services are available through Recreation.gov up to three months in advance for a reservation fee. All Recreation.gov orders are final and reservation fees are NONREFUNDABLE. Pick up tickets reserved less than 10 days before the visit at the Monument Lodge will call window at 15th St NW between Constitution and Independence Avenues. The fee for a reserved ticket is \$1.50.

JEFFERSON MEMORIAL



Tour Description: Honors America's third president. From within the circular colonnade, a 19 foot tall statue of Thomas Jefferson stands holding the Declaration of Independence and peering out to the Tidal Basin.

Address: Located in West Potomac Park by the Tidal Basin, a large body of water that is bordered by DC's famous cherry blossom trees.

Closest Metro Stop: Smithsonian at 12th street and Independence Avenue, SW (Blue and Orange Lines)

Availability: Open 24 hours a day. Rangers are on duty to answer questions daily 9:30am to 10pm

KOREAN WAR MEMORIAL



Tour Description: Features 19 soldiers arrayed for combat, with the American flag as their symbolic objective. A 164-foot wall is etched with 2,500 photographic images of the support personnel whose efforts sustained the military operation.

Address: The Korean War Veterans Memorial resides on the National Mall southeast of the Lincoln Memorial and just south of the Reflecting Pool

Closest Metro Stop: Smithsonian and Federal Triangle on the Orange, Blue and Silver Lines (Foggy Bottom is also an option)

Availability: Open 24 hours a day. Rangers on duty to answer questions daily from 9:30 am to 10pm

LINCOLN MEMORIAL



Tour Description: Features a 19-foot marble statue of our 16th President, Abraham Lincoln. The memorial also exhibits inscriptions of Lincoln's second Inaugural Address and the Gettysburg Address.

Address: The Lincoln Memorial towers over the Reflecting Pool on the national mall. The structure anchors the western end of the Mall. The best way to approach the Memorial is from the east, by the Washington Monument and the National World War II Memorial.

Closest Metro Stop: Foggy Bottom/GWU and Smithsonian (Blue and Orange Lines)

Availability: Open 24 hours a day. Rangers on duty to answer questions daily from 9:30am to 10pm

U.S.M.C. WAR MEMORIAL (IWO JIMA MEMORIAL)



Tour Description: The 78-foot memorial commemorates all marines who have died in battle since 1775. The statue depicts one of the most famous incidents of World War II and symbolizes this nation's esteem for the honored dead of the U.S. Marine Corps. During the summer, the US Marine Corps holds Sunset Parades at the memorial on Tuesday evenings. The memorial plaza is closed to the public from 7 pm to 8 pm on Tuesdays in June and July and from 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm on August 1 and August 8.

Address: Located outside Arlington National Cemetery. In Arlington Ridge Park in Virginia just across the Potomac River

Closest Metro Stop: Arlington Cemetery (Blue Line) or Rosslyn Station (Orange, Silver or Blue line)

Availability: Open 6 AM – midnight year around

VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL



Tour Description: Honors the men and women of the armed forces who served in the Vietnam War. The V-shaped memorial is made of black granite and is inscribed with the names of the 58,272 Americans missing or killed in the Vietnam War. The memorial consists of three separate parts: The Three Soldiers statue, the Vietnam Women's Memorial and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall

Address: Near Constitution Gardens on the National Mall

Closest Metro Stop: Foggy Bottom/GWU or Federal Triangle (Blue, Orange, Silver Lines)

Availability: Open 24 hours a day with rangers on duty from 9:30am to 10pm daily to

answer questions

WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL



Tour Description: One of the National Mall's newest memorials was dedicated to the men and women of World War II – America's Greatest Generation – on May 29, 2004. The memorial honors the 16 million who served in the armed forces of the U.S. during World War II and the more than 400,000 who died. Symbols of America's triumph in the Second World War are artfully displayed all over the World War II Memorial, which has a splendid fountain at its center. 56 granite columns symbolize unity among the 48 states, seven federal territories and the District of Columbia. One of the World War II Memorial's most striking features is the Freedom Wall. 4,048 gold stars pay tribute to American lives lost at

war (each star represents 100 Americans).

FDR MEMORIAL



Tour Description: The memorial traces twelve years of American history through a series of four outdoor areas; each focusing on one of FDR's terms in office.

Address: Cherry Tree Walk along Tidal Basin near the Jefferson Memorial.

Closest Metro Stop: Smithsonian and Federal Triangle (Blue, Silver Orange Lines).

Availability: Open 24 hours daily. No Rangers on duty to answer questions

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. MEMORIAL



Tour Description: The National Mall's newest memorial was dedicated to Martin Luther King, Jr. in honor of his leadership during the Civil Rights movement. On April, 28 2011, the groundbreaking of this monument signified that King's legacy of inspiration, hope, and change will be forever recognized as a part of the national landscape. The Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial is situated on a four-acre site along the Tidal Basin, adjacent to the Franklin D. Roosevelt Memorial and shares a direct line of sight between the Lincoln and Jefferson memorials.

Closest Metro Stop: Smithsonian (Blue Silver and Orange lines).

Availability: Memorial open 24 hours daily with Park Rangers on site from 9:30am to 10pm daily to answer questions.

NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS MEMORIAL



Tour Description: 30 exhibits with mementos left at the memorial, photos from ceremonies, and murals. The Memorial's walls are filled with law enforcement heroes who, while not always household names, played important roles in U.S. history nonetheless. Each of the four pathway entrances to the Memorial walls is adorned with a powerful statuary grouping of an adult lion protecting its cubs. Sculpted by Raymond Kaskey, the statues symbolize the protective role of

our law enforcement officers and convey the strength, courage and valor that are the hallmarks of those who serve. Each adult lion figure weighs approximately 2,500 pounds.

Address: E Street NW, between 4th and 5th Streets. The visitor center is located 2 blocks away at 400 7th St NW.

Closest Metro Stop: Judiciary Square (Red Line). Take the F Street exit.

Availability: Open 24 hours a day. Visitors Center Hours: Monday-Friday: 9 AM – 5 PM, Saturday: 10 AM – 5 PM, Sunday: 12 Noon – 5 PM. THE SMITHSONIAN

FORD'S THEATRE AND LINCOLN MUSEUM



Tour Description: Tribute to President Lincoln's love of the arts. Museum includes the clothes Abraham Lincoln wore on the night of his assassination. On a self-guided tour of the Ford's Theatre Museum, explore Lincoln's presidency from his arrival in Washington to the very minute he arrived at Ford's Theatre the fateful night of April 14, 1865. See rare artifacts related to the assassination. *30-45 minutes*. Attend either a talk by a National Park Service Ranger or the play *One Destiny* (offered in the spring and early summer), featuring costumed actors who portray two historical figures present the night of the assassination. We also offer walk-throughs of the theatre where you can enjoy a self-guided tour without formal programming. 30

Closest Metro Stop: Metro Center (Blue, Orange, & Red Lines) or Gallery Place (Green, Yellow, & Red Lines).

Availability: Tours at the theatre are available between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Talks are presented at fifteen past the hour, every hour except between 12 noon and 2 PM.

Costs: A limited number of free tickets are available at the Ford's Theatre Box Office beginning at 8:30 a.m. for same-day tickets on a first-come, first-served basis. Advance individual tickets are \$3.00. Tickets for groups of 15 or more are \$2.50.

Notes: Because Ford's Theatre also functions as an active stage with live performances there are times when the theatre will be closed to the public. HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL MUSEUM



Tour Description: Three floors of history covering from the period that the Nazi's rose to power to the liberation of the concentration camps after WWII

Address: 14th St and Raoul Wallenberg Place in Washington, DC

Nearest Metro Stop: Smithsonian (orange or blue line)

Availability: The Permanent Exhibition and special exhibitions are open from 10 a.m. to 5:20 p.m., with extended spring hours until 6:30 p.m. During the months of March through August, timed passes are required to enter the Permanent Exhibition.

Costs: Free.

How to Request a Tour: Timed passes are necessary for visiting the Permanent Exhibition. These can be obtained the morning of your visit outside the museum on the day of your visit, or in advance by calling (800) 400-9373. Each

day, the Museum distributes on a first-come first-served basis a large but limited number of timed entry passes for use that same day.

INTERNATIONAL SPY MUSEUM



Tour Description: The only public museum in the world solely dedicated to the tradecraft, history, and contemporary role of espionage. The Museum's permanent exhibition presents the tradecraft of espionage through the stories of individuals and their missions, tools and techniques. Exhibits feature the largest collection of international espionage artifacts ever on public display – many for the first time.

Address: The entire city block between 9th and 8th Streets at 800 F Street, NW

Closest Metro Stop: Gallery Place/Chinatown Metro (Green, Yellow, & Red Lines)

Availability: All tickets are date and time specific. Advance tickets are highly recommended and can be purchased at <http://www.spymuseum.org/tickets/>

Costs: Adult (ages 12-64): \$22.95, Seniors (65+) and Active Duty Military & Intel Community: \$16.95, Children (ages 7-11): \$14.95, Children age 6 and under are free.

How to Request a Tour: Groups of 20 or more qualify for Group Admission and require advance reservations which can be made by calling the Group Sales Manager at (202) 654-0944.

Notes: The Museum is closed Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. On occasion the Museum closes earlier than regular visiting hours. Such early closings will be posted at www.spymuseum.org.

NATIONAL BUILDING MUSEUM



Tour Description: It is a museum of architecture, design, engineering, construction and urban planning. Exhibits change yearly and range from Shakespeare to 21st Century to years of Domestic Architecture to America's World's Fairs.




